



FATAL OCCUPATIONAL INJURIES

In 2017, one Minnesota worker died every 87 hours (3.6 days).




- **3.5:** Minnesota's fatal occupational injury rate in 2017.
- **3.5:** National fatal occupational injury rate in 2017.






Amost one in three fatal workplace injuries involved driving a vehicle.




NON-FATAL INJURIES AND ILLNESSES

198/day: Number of nonfatal workplace injuries and illnesses, 2017.


100/day: Number of serious workplace injuries and illnesses requiring time off, job transfer or other restrictions, 2017.






WORKERS' COMPENSATION

The number of claims has dropped since 2008, but the inflation-adjusted cost per claim has remained near \$11,000.








